WHAT HAPPENS AT A CPW EVENT?

Every CPW has its own theme, chosen by the chair, which is explored during the week through talks, discussions, and various activities.

The CPW team, led by the chair and assisted by excellent speakers, present ideas around the theme to the adults in morning and early evening sessions. We aim to use varied approaches, to suit all learning styles. There are opportunities to respond to the presentations, individually and in group work, which are enjoyable, inclusive and stimulating. Serious discussion interspersed with laughter is a common feature of these sessions.

Meanwhile, on our all-age weeks a team of trained helpers lead separate sessions for the children and young people. These sessions are fun-filled, enjoyable, safe, healthy and varied; often encompassing art, drama or film-making, as well as swimming, playing games and sport. Whatever the members of your family enjoy doing we will do our best to accommodate them.

The afternoons are free to spend time with friends and family relaxing, having some quiet time, or exploring the local area.

The evening sessions include time for discussion and reflection on the themes of the day. The later evenings provide opportunities for relaxed conversation and socialising. There is usually a small informal 'bar' as well as optional evening activities such as games, singalongs and quizzes. These activities are run on a volunteer basis. Liturgy is an integral part of every CPW day and is encouraged to arise naturally as a response to the event's theme. Everyone is welcome to contribute to our prayers, the celebration of Mass and other forms of worship. Our liturgies are creative and inclusive. Our chaplains are part of the event team from the outset and are skilled in facilitating participation.

Place and time are important factors to your enjoyment. For busy participants our one-day events are located near good public transport access and/or have parking facilities. For those with more time to relax and reflect, our 18+ residential centres have a calmer atmosphere and are located in guieter more rural locations

For those with children and young people to care for, our all-age events take place in school holidays in centres with space and facilities for fun activities.

We aim to provide events which are accessible and enjoyable for all abilities.

In the year of CPW's 75th Anniversary we will use stories of inspirational people who have been part of CPW's history to find ways to respond to challenges today.

The speaker for the Dora Turbin Lecture on Saturday 15th will be David McLoughlin, Emeritus Fellow of Christian Theology at Newman University, Birmingham. In his research he explores the relationship between theology and everyday life. On the challenge of prophetic imagination in 2020, David says "in every age we need men and women who open up for us the prophetic imagination of a Moses at the burning bush, or Hosea and Amos in a time of national crisis and of Jesus in his time".


The chaplain is Columban Father Jim Fleming who worked in Pakistan for 20 years and now raises awareness about missionary outreach and supports asylum seekers in Birmingham. Ellen Teague is part of the Columban Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation Team, and works as a Catholic journalist on justice, peace and ecology issues. She has been involved with Catholic Peoples Weeks since the late 1980s.


